doqueath unto my dear husband the son of John Wood my wife & my
George to him I give & devise them I give unto a Legit Wifey my dear son the
son of David Wifey just my negrowoman Sarah & my son John
his heirs them I give unto John Wifey my first & last my wearing clothes
them I give unto Eliz Wifey my sister my feather bed and furniture & one
Cow and Calf the rest I leave to my will is that after my last debts and funeral
expenses are paid that the remaining part of my Estate be equally divided
between my dear wife & my son that he be my executor & my
appoint John Wood executor of this my will in writing & sign
put my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

At a Court held for Stafford County the 12 Day of November 1734.
The above last will & Testament of Charles Witt deceased was read in Court
and proved by the oaths of David Wifey & Geo Wifey his witnesses to it
