in manner and form following etc. After I give my son James Grigsby
the summing at his mouth of fifteen bushels and running up the main
style James Grigsby son of said and running Northward to left
I give to my loving wife Sarah Grigsby ninety acres of land begin
beginning to James Grigsby son of said running Northward to left
or her decease to return to my son Charles Grigsby. Item I give
to my son Charles Grigsby at his return and if he not returning
within a reasonable time to his wife know
the child my wife know
daughter of negroes named James and if it come not
in my daughter named from me named James and if it come not
in my son Charles ELSA
it to my son Charles Grigsby Item I give to my son Charles
a man named Hobie item I leave them in the care of my widow
till Negroes until the said child shall come to the age of eighteen
and James to return to my son Charles Grigsby and Hobie to my
son John Grigsby that remainor of my at his return
turning I give it to my son Wilkerson Grigsby.
