four hundred acres that I bought of Aboratio Dade Gent^l one hundred acres
I reserve to my brother William Todd & to the heirs of his body lawfully
begotten to be laid off to him as my Executors hereafter mentioned shall
think fit the other six hundred acres to be equally divided between my two
Sons Samuel and Richard & to the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten & in
fault of such then to my Daughter Lucy & her heirs lawfully begotten for
ever Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Lucy one feather bed & furniture
of two Linnen and Colours one Iron pot one frying pan two pewter dishes two Linnen
& six silver plates to be delivered to her by my Executors & Executor hereafter
mentioned if she live to receive the same Item it is my will & desire that
as much of my personal Estate be sold as will pay my Just Debts my
Negroes excepted It is my will & desire that all the residue of my
Personal Estate be kept in the hands of my Ex^{rs} & Ex^{or} to be improved
them in the best manner they shall see fit for the maintenance and
Education of my Children & the

& two cows and calves one iron pot one frying pan two pewter dishes two tins
& six new plates to be delivered to her by my Executors & Executor hereafter
mentioned if she live to receive the same Item it is my will & desire that
as much of my personal Estate be sold as will pay my Just Debts my
Negroes excepted It is my will & desire that all the residue of my
Personal Estate be kept in the hands of my Exors & Exor to be improved
them in the best manner they shall see fit for the maintenance and
educating my Children & the remainder to be equally divided among
my three Children & their heirs forever Item it is my desire that my
Exors shall be bound to such Trades as shall best suit them after they
have got a fulling sufficient for the living business to be carried on

my loving wife Sarah Todd & Joseph William Rowley my sole & true
Executor of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fourth day
of June one thousand seven hundred and fifty four
