order thereto I give and bequeath as followseth I do further declare that all my debts may  
be fully paid & satisfied by me & my wife give and bequeath all and singular my

And before the sealing hereof, all these present do reciprocally declare and  
acknowleage that he, the said Robert, is now aforesaid a widow, whose present estate by reason of  
the said death of her late husband, is now in the said Robert, and that she  
and so all her children are now in want of a maintenance, wherefore she
