after the following manner. I myself have...
bequeath my son William Suddeth one slave or both
Furniture box that will be commonly called his bed
also one cow & calf all slaves I leave to him & his heirs
for ever. I also leave bequeath to my son James
Suddeth slaves for ever ^{both} & his wife who
now leaves also two cows & calves & pot & casseroles
his brother. I also leave bequeath to my daughter Mary
during her life or in default of her leaving estate & goods
whatsoever not above mentioned in case of her death I leave
all to my Grandson Edward Suddeth with direction that
it may be apprais'd & ordered & determined for him until he
comes of age to be delivered to him at that time & if case of
my Grandsons death I leave all to my son James &
an heir for ever Also I leave also.... to my wife Mary
Suddeth one black boy named Tom to own & him and
she shall have proper & firstly & appoint my slaves in her name
I do further whole & sole gift of my last will & testament
In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this

At a Court held for Stafford County 13 March 1753 —
This last will & Testament of James Suddeth was made
proven before me by James Ladd Esq'r Notary Public
and witnesseth that the said James Suddeth did
bring his power by witness of the handwriting thereon
and attested the same before me on the 13 day of March

also one cow & calf all the rest I leave to him & his heirs
for ever. If Mr. Glazebrook & Co. will do you justice
suddenly & without notice for ever ^{out of} ~~out of~~ his estate which he
now has. Also two cows & calves a pair... Cows I leave to
his brother. If Mr. Glazebrook & Co. will do you justice
Mary during her life or in default of any estate & property
which so ever not above mentioned I do... I leave to him & his wife
all my Grandson James made addable with direction that
it may be appraised & determined for him until he
comes of age to be delivered to him at that time a facsimile
of my Grandsons death. I leave all to my son James &
an heir for ever Mr. Glazebrook & Co. leaving wife Mary
sudden or otherwise to have to do with him as
she thinks proper I do by my loving will setting
In default of whole & sole estate of Mr. Glazebrook & Co.
