pounds of Tobacco which is due to me from William Crossford, my
dear father, to his said daughter, 100th shillings & 6 pence of 50th shillings
I will pay him, I also ordain my grandmother, Mary Anne, my sole
sole executor of this my Last Will & Testament in witness whereof
I set my hand and seal this 13 day of April 1733.
