lish and certify this my last will and Testament in manner & form
following (that is to say) First and Principally I recommend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the merits death
& Passion of my Blessed Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive
full & perfect pardon and remission of my sins and to inherit in everlasting
salvation and my body I Commit to the Earth to be decently & buried
at the Discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned as touching
the disposition of such Temporal Estate as it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me I give And bequeath thereof as follows to wit
I give unto my son John Grygby & his heirs half of 4 Tract of
Land & Tract of Nicholas Ballan near his Spring branch to 4
acres more or less by him In this deed and likewise I give
Three Negro named Sucke Thomas Dick & John Grygby unto
Charles Grygby all that small of Land from the Spring to the
touching line between my land & being in the district of 40 Acres
I give And bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ann & her heirs
Beside her said her heirs & their heirs unto my slave James
Grygby all that Branch of Land & Branch of Land from the
Branch of the Spring Branch to the Spring of the Spring
John Spring branch and likewise I give unto my
son & all his heirs & his heirs to have his land & his
unto my son John Grygby all that Branch of Land from the
touching line between my land & being in the district of 40 Acres

to him and his heirs for ever. - And I give unto my son
Thomas Grigsby all the Remainder Part of that Battain of
Bought of Battain from the end of 100 lb. Sil Point up to the
Branch to my Head line on the East Side of y^e Branch also
I give him the said Tract of Land whereon ^{to him and his heirs} now I live, and
likewise I give him three negroes, Isaac, Henry, & Mary and
their Increase to him & his heirs for ever and likewise I give
unto my son Thomas Grigsby all my Hogg belonging
me and likewise I give him half my Cattle and the other
half of Cattle to be Divided Between my other Sons and
Daughter and likewise all my other Part of my
moveables, to be equally Divided Between my Son
Children and further I Doe Desire that my Estate may not
be brought to an Appraisement. - And further I Doe appoint my
Two Sons John and Thomas Grigsby to be my Executors of
this my last Will & Testament soe that every Thing Equally
Divided Between themselves Revoking all former Wills as
witness my hand and Seale this 17th March 1720/9
