The within last will & Testament of Joseph Waugh deceased was
presented into Court by William Waugh Esq. the executor named/
George Waugh the heir at law to the Testator not being of Age James
Waugh is appointed his Guardian, who made no objection to the
proving the same / who made Oath there to according to Law and
the same being further proved by the Oath of the witnesses is ad-
mitted to record. Commotion of the said &c. &c. the performing what is con-
tained in such Cases Certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probat thereof in due form.

shipful Court of Stafford County bearing date the 6 day of May 1748.
We the subscribers being appointed by the said Court to appraise
and inventory the Estate of Mr. Jos. Waugh deceased to make & return
thereof to the next Court: On Monday the 16 day of the said month
we proceeded to appraise & inventory the same being first sworn before
Cap. James Waugh one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for this County
