I give bequeath my soul into the hands of God
up & trusting the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ
to receive forgiveness of all my sins & my body to be
buried in such place as shall be thought good at the discretion of my
executors hereafter named Langham & his heirs

At this last day as for what goods it hath pleased God to
bestow on me I give & devise as followeth viz: I give
I give & bequeath to my dear wife Mildred Dadd all the lot
that is hath pleased God to bestow on me during her widow-
hood if she marries I desire that my whole Estate may be
Equally divided between my dear wife & my son Townsend &
Cadwallader Jones Dadd my desire is that my wife's part may
be her for ever. My desire is that this part of Land where I
now live on that purchased of Mr. Robert Mafsey may be
Acknowledged by him to my son Cadwallader Jones Dadd and
I desire that my dear wife may have it in her possession during
her widowhood but if she marries I desire she may be moved off
Immediately. I desire that if my son Cadwallader Dadd, efforts to
Violate or disturb her of her right in the time of her widowhood
he may forfeit his part of my Estate. My will & desire is that
my dear wife keep my two sons Townsend & Cadwallader Dadd
& their Estates during her widowhood, and if she marries before
they come of age I desire that my brother Baldwin Dadd take
my son Townsend Dadd his Estate into his possession till he
comes of age. And I desire that my good friend Lawrence
Washington take my son Cadwallader Jones Dadd his Estate into
his possession till he comes of age, in case Lawrence Wash-
