mind & Memory do make this my last will & Testament in manner
following I recommend my soul to God humbly promising for
Myself through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ my
body to be buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named
I leave to my son & daughter also called brother & sister James
Lindley & my Daughter Eleanor all I have called & my
saddle & all my wearing apparel. I leave to the said Eleanor an
Orphan Girl now with me whom she shall arrive at the age of
eighteen & shall be called. All the rest & residue of my Estate I
give to my said son & Daughter to be equally divided between
them but the half that belongs to my son is to be delivered to
Joseph Smith in trust for my said son till he shall arrive at
the age of twenty years. and I appoint the said Joseph Smith
Guardian of my said son desiring that he may be put to school
from the time of my death for one year & then to be bound
to the said Joseph Smith for the space of three years to learn
the trade of a carpenter. and I appoint the said Joseph Smith
of this my last will & Testament whereby reaches all for-
mer & other wills declaring this to be my last will & Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 4th Day of February 1748/9.

A Court held for Hathor County August the 8th 1749
The above last will & Testament of Mary Lindley deceased was
presented into Court by Joseph Smith the said & therein named
executor & oath taken

Now to my son Robert a horse called Bratcher, a saddle gun
and a long Daughters Eleanor a Mare called Macy. My
saddle and my wearing apparel. I leave to the said son and
Daughters. And now with me when she shall arrive at the age of
eighteen she shall call. All the rest and residue of my Estate I
give to my said son and Daughters to be equally divided between
them but the half that belongs to my son is to be delivered to
Joseph Smith in trust for my said son till he shall arrive at
the age of twenty years, and I appoint the said Joseph Smith
Guardian of my said son desiring that he may be put to school
from the time of my Death for one year & then to be bound
to the said Joseph Smith for the space of three years to learn
the trade of a carpenter, and I appoint the said Joseph Smith
of this my last will & Testament whereby to have all for-
mer & other wills relating this to be my last will & Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 7th Day of February 1748/9.

At Court held for Statters County August the 8th 1749

true. And a commission of the said Ex^r & he is bound to do what is
required in such cases. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probate thereof in due form.
