Stafford County, Widow being sick but of perfect sense and
memory, do make & Ordain this & this only to be my last will &
Testament hereby revoking, annulling, & making void all other
will or wills by me before made in manner & form following
Imprimis I recommend my immortal soul to GOD who gave
hoping through the merits of my blessed saviour for a free part
of my sin at the day of the general resurrection & as for my body
I desire it may be decently interred in the Earth & for what
worldly Estate GOD hath been pleased to bless me with I dispose
in the following manner It Em I give devise & bequeath unto
my son William Mountjoy a large Bible & a large Oval table
also eight hundred & forty Acres of Land lying upon Licking
River & the branches of the March Run in Prince William
County to him & his heirs forever. It Em I give & bequeath
to my son Peter Maury three hundred Acres of Land upon
the Run in Prince William County where Francis Watts
now lives & at the decease of my said son, I leave for the said
Land to be given to any of my said sons Children or he shall
think fit, also a Gold Ring It Em I give & bequeath to my
Daughter Elizabeth Conway one hundred & fifty Acres of Land

12 I have said I have in Prince William County, it being part
of the tract aforesaid during her life and after her decease her son
John Markham & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten if those
John Markham dies without issue then for it to fall to Peter
Conway my grandson. Likewise I give & bequeath to the said son
Markham One hundred & fifty acres of land it being the other
half of the three hundred acres whereof I have in the last paragraph
given my Daughter Elizabeth. And I give & bequeath to the said
John Markham dies without issue then for the said land to
fall to my grandson Thomas Conway & also I give the said
Markham One feather bed & furniture as also one small Dresser
& one bath in the Millott now in his mother's possession. And
all the rest of my personal Estate whatsoever after my Decease
I give to my Daughter Mary Doniphane & her heirs for
ever. Lastly I do appoint my son William Manning and
Peter Maury Esqrs of this last will & Testament as my
hand & seal this 27th Day of March Anno Dom. 1749

 Peter Maury Esqrs of this County will & Testament as I will be my
 hands seal this 27th Day of March Anno Dom 1749.
