

John Gregg five pounds to be paid out of the Estate Item I give to my well beloved sister Lucy Gregg five pounds in cash Item I give to my well beloved sister Samina Gregg fifty shillings Item I give to my well beloved cousin William Pake the son of Lucy my riding horse named Prince bridle and saddle Item I give to my well beloved cousin John Pake the son of Lucy Pake two heifers I leave my loving Brother John Gregg and John Pake my whole and sole Executors of all my whole Estate, December the thirteenth one thousand seven hundred & forty nine Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence of us — Mathew Gregg his mark

At a Court held for Stafford County the ninth day of August 1757 Administration with the will annexed of Mathew Gregg deceased is granted William Gorman having entered into Bond with John Fitzhugh and Henry Tyler his securities And the said Will being proved by the Oaths of William Pake and John Pake witnesses to the same, is on motion of the said William Gorman admitted to Record — Test — Henry Tyler Esq

In the name of God amen I Anthony Thornton of Stafford County being in perfect memory do make & ordain this my Last will & Testament in manner following I bequeath to my son Presly Thornton the several Negroes he has in his possession which I have a title in right of my wife with the several manse except Negro Grace & her children which I have before given & do now confirm to my son Francis and his heirs for ever Item I give to my beloved wife Winnepesed the Tract of Land whereon I now live during her natural life & after her death to my son Francis & his heirs for ever Item I give to my son Anthony Thornton the Land I have at the mountain to him & his heirs for ever Item I give to my daughter Winnepesed Berman a Tract of Land on Nash ran in Stafford County containing six hundred & fifty acres to her the said Winnepesed & the heirs of her body for ever Item I give to my son Peter Thornton a Tract of Land on Malloping containing thirteen hundred & thirteen acres to him & his heirs for ever with all the Negroes stock of Cattle Hogs & all other things on the said Plantation I also give to my said son Peter ten head of young Cattle from the Plantation from live on together with Negroes Jacob Blackwell Roger & Violet to him & his heirs for ever Item I give to my wife Winnepesed Berman a Tract of low ground whereon William Garner now lives during her life & after her death to my son Anthony and his heirs for ever Item I give to my said wife Negroes James Sarah & Boy Billy & little Sammy during her life & after her death to my son Peter & his heirs for ever Item I give the rest of my Negroes not before disposed to my said wife to be at her disposal together with my stock of horses Cattle hogs & sheep Item I give the rest of my Estate to be divided between my said wife & my son Peter Thornton My desire is that my Estate shall not be appraised Lastly I constitute & appoint my said son Peter Thornton Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this third day of January one thousand seven hundred and fifty seven Signed sealed & published in the presence of — Anthony Thornton
