In the Name of God Amen I Oliver Littlejohn of the County of Stafford being very sick and weak but of perfect and sound memory blessed be to God for it do ordain & appoint this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of the Almighty God who gave it me and my Body unto the Earth from whence it was taken as for the rest of worldly Estate I give and bequeath as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Marlow Littlejohn and Charles Littlejohn all my Land equally to be divided between them when they come of Age Item I give and bequeath unto my son Marlow Littlejohn my Bed whereon I now and the best rugg by the best pair of Blankets Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Littlejohn one Bed wth the same Tick in as my Bed hath and a pair of Blankets and a Rugg Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Joan Littlejohn one bed with a cover as Tick and two Ruggs and one new bed ticking out of my chest Item I give and bequeath unto my son Marlow Littlejohn one cow named Cherry and her increase one sorrell mare branded on the Top of the near Buttock with O.L. one Iron Pot & Pot hooks one broad brimmed dish one narrow ditto two Plates one long saw one hand saw two Iron pridges Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Joan Littlejohn one black cow named Grammy and her Increase one black mare called Tommy and her Increase branded on the Buttock with O.L. one Iron Pot and Pot hooks one long saw one hand saw two Plates Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Littlejohn one young horse named Snowberry one sorrell mare which runs still bolt and her Increase one brimmed dish one narrow ditto one great Iron Pot and Pot hooks one long saw one hand saw two plates Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons all my hoppers and carpenters tools in general Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Withers one young horse Colt one new penster Wagon one turn Potter Chamber Pot Item I give and bequeath to my Grand son John Withers one black Mare branded on the near Shoulder with O.L. one bow ball and her Increase Item I give and bequeath unto my God daughter Mary Kemp the Daughter of Robert Kemp one Red Woifer named Do and her Increase as for the rest of my Personal Estate to be inventoried & recorded & equally to be divided between my four Children when they are come unto the Age of Chosen or the Day of Marriage Item my will and desire is that my two sons Marlow Littlejohn & Charles Littlejohn shall
