Imp^o I give & recomend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God
that gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner
and as for my worldly Estate I dispose thereof as follows Item I leave
to my loving wife Mary the use of my whole Estate during her
natural life and after her decease I give and bequeath to my
Grandson William Grady my best bed & furniture seven pewter
Dishes one Dozen of Pewter plates a large Chest a Bell mether
mortar & Pestle & a horse called Saffy to him and his heirs for ever
Item I give to my Grandson William Grady the Plantation and
whereon I now live to him and his heirs and assigns for ever Item
my will and desire is that if my Grandson William Grady dies before
he comes to the age of twenty one years that my whole Estate real
& personal may fall to my Grandchildren to be divided
amongst them William John George Catherine & Mary Randall
Item I desire that Richard Bandal have the Plantation on lease
for his life till my Grandson William Grady comes of age Item
my will & desire is that all the rest of my Estate be sold and

The money arising by such sale to be kept in the hands of my son for
the use of my said Grandson William Gady and his heirs for ever except
Ten pounds which I give to be equally divided between my four grand
children William John George and Mary Ann at to be paid as they
severally come of age or on the day of Marriage And I do appoint
my Trusty friends Linchfield Sharp Sen^r of Long George County &
John Payton of Stafford County whole & sole Ex^{rs} of this my last
Will & Testament revoking all other will or wills by me heretofore
made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this nineteenth day of October 1756
