to be by them sold and equally divided that is to my Mary Elz. & Ann to be paid
unto them or any of them at Eighteen or the day of Marriage but if any of
them shall happen to dye before they arrive to that Age then part to be divided
between the Survivors & if any 2 of them shall happen to dye the Survivors
and in case all three should dye to the next heir & his heirs and bequeath
my loving wife Mary Bramble one Part of said lying in Parish with and now
occupied by Thomas Masters to her & her assigns Item I give & bequeath to my
loving Brother Daniel Bramble all my wearing Apparel and as for my Personal Estate
my Will & desire is to have it appraised and after my Debt & funeral Charge
defraide to be equally divided betwixen my loving wife & my son Thomas &
my three Daughters Mary Elz. & Ann to be paid to them when they shall
arrive to Eighteen years or the day of Marriage and that my loving wife
shall have the profit of their Estate till they come to age or the day of
Marriage I do ordain & appoint my loving wife Mary & my loving
brother Daniel to watch & see of this my Last Will & Testament &
Deeds & Renounce & make void all other wills by me made and do
