bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Monday five pounds current money of Virg
to her and her heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary
Horton five pounds current money of Virginia to her and her heirs for ever Item
I give and bequeath to my two sons Samuel & John Thornberry all the rest of my
Estate as well Real as personal whatsoever & wheresoever to be Equally divided
between them after my just Debts are paid to them & their heirs for ever Item my
will and desire is that my two sons Samuel & John Thornberry be my Executors
of this my last Will and Testament for witnesses whereof I have hereunto
my hand and seal this sixth day of August 1755.
