and all the Land belonging thereto as witness my hand and seal this 2nd of March 1742

Benjamin Duncum presented in Court the Last will and Testament of the said Thomas Duncum

The Court being satisfied of the due execution of the said will and Testament of the said Thomas Duncum
is granted him for obtaining a confirmation of the said will and Testament of the said Thomas Duncum
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
