to her & her heirs for ever, And the half of my slaves are to be divided in four
Equal Parts to wit one to my Brother John, one to James, one to William
& the fourth to be Equally Divided amongst the Children of my Brother
Charles Deceased, to em and their Heirs for ever, And the moiety of my
Personal Estate to be Divided in the same manner.

Next I give and bequeath to my Brother James Grigsby at my wifes
Decease all my Lands in Stafford County to him & his heirs for ever —

Item I give to my Brother William Grigsby at my wifes Decease
all my Lands in King George County to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I constitute & appoint my wife sole Executrix of this my Last will
