In the name of god AMEN I William one of the Parish of Overwharton and County of Stafford Planter being very weak & long but still here hence and sound Memory blessed be therefore almighty god to make certain and Publish this my Last will and Testament in manner and form following Vizt
I Inprimis I give and bequeath unto my son James all my Lands & Tenements with their and every of their appurtenances situate lying and being in the said Parish and County to him the said James and the heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for ever and for default of such issue then I give the same to my daughter Elizabeth the second the heirs of her body Lawfully begotten for ever and for default of such issue then I give the same to my right hand Son John I give unto my said son James the sum of five hundred pounds to wit £500 I give to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Elizabeth three Negroes to wit
 Giles Daniel Lacey to her and her heirs forever also one good new feather bed bolsters
 and Pillows a pair of sheets a Quilt and a Rugg with a furs and bedstead. Item I give
 and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Anne one third part of all my lands and
 Tenements aforesaid for and during her Natural life also the three following Negroes
 viz. Roger Peter and Hannah to be at her own will and disposal. Item I give and
 bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Anne my son James and my daughter Elizabeth
 all the Residue of my Personal Estate of what kind or Nature soever to be equally
 divided among them. Item I desire that these three Negroes to wit Brother Winny
 and London may be sold at auction to the highest bidder by my Executors hereafter
 mentioned and the money arising from the sale to be by them applyed towards the
 payment of my debts. Also I make and ordain my beloved wife Anne and Mr
 John Waugh Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and
 annulling all former and other wills by me heretofore made In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of July in the
 Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty two
 Signed Sealed and delivered by the said
 William Lacy as and for his last will
 and Testament in the presence of us
 John Hamilton John Frogg H. Tylers.
