following Viz^t I give unto my Daughter Margaret my

to my Daughter Jane, one Mare Colt. I will & desire after
my Debt & Funeral Expenses is paid, that the rest of my Estate
shall be sold & Equally divided to my wife & the rest of Children
I will & desire that James Phillips take my two sons John &
William & their Estates to be put to the use of schooling them I will
my will & desire Benj^m McCullough shall have my two Daughters
Sarah & Lurina & their part of the Estate to be disposed in
schooling them. I will & desire to appoint for Mark & James
Phillips Ex^{rs} of the same last will & Testament Whereunto I have
set my hand & seal this 16th Day of December 1789
