In primis I give my soul into the hands of almighty
 God that gave it hoping for pardon & remission of all my
 sins thro the merits & satisfaction of blessed & dear Jesus
 Christ my body to the Earth to be decently buried according
 to the discretion of E. & hereafter mentioned as near
 my last will as possible and as to such worldly goods as I
 have I leave to God to dispose of in the following
 manner I will that all debts due in right or convenience be
 paid as hereafter directed **Item** I give to my son William all
 my land lying & being in Diocese of Worcester & in the
 parish of St. Martin for ever **Item** I give to my E. & hereafter
 mentioned all my Land & crops & stocks of every kind I do
 possess of in the parish of St. Pauls in Staffor to be by them
 sold & confirmed as they shall see fit to any person or persons
 able to purchase for the payment of my debts & for my
 the two bonds in which the said Thomas & I have been
 with us one to Mr. John Corbin for four hundred pounds
 current money the other to Mr. Peter Birch for one hundred
 & twenty five pounds current money. **Item** I direct
 that all other my Personal Estate which is liable to be sold
 be sold **Item** whereas I have owned a plantation at a place
 called known by the name of Pocklington
 lying & being in Cranwellton Parish in this County with
 I have from the Rev. Mr. John Manners during his life
 that many slaves & young children be kept for the benefit
 and stock sufficient to keep up the same for the benefit
 of the said plantation. **Item** whereas I have many

to the discretion of E. & her after mentioned as usual
my last wife as possible and to such worldly goods
that please God to bless me with I dispose of in the following
manner I will that all debts down right or convenient be
paid as hereafter directed. I give to my son William all
my land lying & being in Parish of William & Fair for County
of Lincoln his heirs forever. I give to my E. & her after
mentioned all my Land Crops & Stocks of every kind I do
possess of in the parish of St. Pauls in Stafford to be by them
sold & confirmed as soon as I shall in any person's
able to purchase for the payment of my debts & especially
the two bonds in which the Honble Thomas & Co. are bound
with me one to Mr. John Corbin for four hundred pounds
current money the other to Col. Peter Percy for one hundred
and twenty five pounds current money. I give
that all other my Personal Estate which is liable to be sold
be sold I give where as I have now a Reputation at a place
called known by the name of Dooly Langry
lying & being in Birmingham Parish in the County of
Leeds from the Rev. Mr. John Manners during his life
that so many Slaves as my said estate shall be convenient
and stock sufficient to be kept upon the same for the benefit
profit of all my Children. I give where as I have many
built since now on hand many workmen many tools & many
Materials for carrying on the same & many more daily
Export from London & other parts of Great Britain I give
that all my E. & her with full power to contract with others

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Workmen to buy what ever they think proper towards
furnishing & completing the same in as full & ample manner
as I could do were I living & the profits to be divided among
all my Children. I Mr Jossins that my E^d Donations full &
Sufficient Deeds for two hundred acres & a part of the
last I took up in Partnership with W^r John Short of this
County in Prince William County to the heirs of Robert
Bowling having given bond so to do when the same require
ed & received a consideration of thirty pounds current in my
in a wrap of bond in his lifetime. I Mr Jossins will
that all the rest of Estate be kept together till my son will
arrive to the age of twenty... Year & then an Equal division
of the whole be made & divided among all my Children
I Mr Jossins ^{constituted} appoint my worthy friends the Honble Tho^s
