but in Case she marry then she is to have seven years to provide for self in

Item. I give unto my Loving Son William Fleeth the plantation whereon he lives and one hundred and fifty
Acres of Land thereunto belonging lying in St^{er} George County to him & his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I give to my daughter Elizabeth one hundred Acres of Land lying upon W^m. Fleeth in Prince George County
to her and her heirs for ever

I give unto my Loving wife Sarah who I appoint my sole & Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament
all the remainder part of my Estate by her to be enjoyed. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
