 also I give to my Son Cyril my three Slaves namely Jack, Combo, and Jenny to him and his heirs for
 Ever but it is my Will and desire. my Loving wife. Judith should have the Labour of the three Slaves
 during the term and time of my Son Cyril being under twenty one years of age
 Item I give and bequeath all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided between all my Children & Living
 wife my debts and funerall Expences being first paid and discharged and I do make my wife Judith
 my whole and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament In Witnes whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and placed a Seal this twenty first day of February in the presents of us 1719

Item I give and bequeath unto my four Children the Sum of Seventeen pounds Ten Shillings Currant
 money to be equally divided amongst them share and share alike being so much that I have Liberty
 to dispose of by Vertue of a marriage Contract for that purpose And Last I appoint Thomas Allster
 my Execut^{or} to see this my Will performed and desire that my Son William Brookings may live with
 and be under the tuition of the said Thomas Allster untill such time as he is of age to be for
 himself and Possess his Estate In Witnes of which I have hereunto put my hand and Seal
 this 29th day of February 1719
