Item I give to my son Arthur Jones my working Clothes and my shoe makers tools and my two guns and a bill of Thomas Gibbons for six hundred pounds of Tobacco and a bill of Phillips Super for six hundred pounds of Tobacco and Coopers tools

Item I give to my Daughter Mary hoot one Shilling

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah a parcel of Lands lying between Josephs Swamp and Nollaway River beginning at Dobys Lower Corner tree so running on Dobys Line to a red oak Corner tree thence Sotherlyward to Nollaway River to a marked tree so running down the River to the fishing place and down the bottom to a mark and then Sotherlyward to the River and do with the River to the mouth of Josephs and a Cow and Calf to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give to my Daughter Jane a parcel of Lands beginning at Dobys Corner pine so Sotherly to the River and a Cow and Calf and two pewter Dishes to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give to my Daughter Mary all the rest of my Lands after her mothers Decease to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give to my Daughter Prudence my negro boy Dick provided that old John Fulman will acknowledge the land to his son Henry where he now dwelt to him and his heirs for ever after so done I give the Negro to them and their heirs for ever

Item I give to my Daughter Eliz^z Jones my negro boy Darby to her and her heirs for ever and a Cow and Calf and two Pewter Dishes

Item I give to my Loving Wife Prudence all the rest of my State real and Personal with two Negroes named Sew and Robin to her and her heirs for ever

Now after all I make my Loving wife Prudence my Executrix first to pay the Debts then the Legacies of this will

Last Will and Testament and do appoint James Sammon and Giles Underhill as executors given under my hand and Seal this

Especially for the rents and Covenants hereen of the mentioned demised Lease and to farm Lett unto the said Bryan Farrell his
Ex^{rs} and by these presents the said Robert Jones doth for himself his heirs Ex^{rs} &c. let Lease and to farm Lett unto the said
Bryan Farrell his Ex^{rs} &c. one certain tract or parcel of Land Situate on the South side of Nottoway River in the County of Surrey
and bounded as followeth (Viz^t) beginning at a willow oak on the East side of the Spring Swamp thence South thirty Degrees West
Eighty one pole to a red oak thence South fifty four Degrees East forty two pole to a pine thence South South East Sixty three pole to a red oak
thence South thirty one Degrees East Ninety four pole to a white oak then North Eighty Degrees East Sixty six pole to a red oak then North
Twenty two Degrees East Twenty seven pole to a white oak by the side of the Spring Swamp aforesaid and up the various Courses of the
said Swamp to the beginning Containing one hundred and twenty Acres of Land: To have and to hold the said one hundred
