I Give and bequeath my Soul to God that gave it me trusting in the merits & merits of my Saviour for a full pardon & forgiveness of all my sins and my body to the Ground to be decently buried at the discretion of my Execut^r & Ad^r hereafter named and as for what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I Give and bequeath in manner & form as followeth—
