First then (in particular) I Do bequeath unto James Badoch all my wearing Apparell after my Decease.

- Item. I do bequeath unto Benjamin Nichols, a Bible. —
- Item. I Do bequeath unto Nath: Dolling Jun^r Twenty Shillings. —
- Item. I Do bequeath unto my Loving Wife Ann all my household goods to be at her Disposal.
- Item. to my said Wife Ann one Negro called Kate as Long as She lives, & when She Dies, & the said Kate be given to Benjamin Evans (if alive after her Death) But if he be Dead before her then John Evans shall have the said Negro wench, and if the said Negro Wench brings forth a child that one fruit of her body be given to William Evans after her Decease.
