And for what worldly Estate it hath pleased the Lord to possess me with after my Debts and funeral Charges is repaid I give bequeath and dispose of as followeth.

Imprimis

I Give and bequeath all that my Plantation and Land in York County Situate in Northampton Parish, known by the name of the Upper City which came to me by my first wife Containing One hundred and fifty Acres more or less to my Daughter Mary Morland and to the heirs of her body. Lawfully begotten for ever. I further Give and bequeath to my said Daughter Mary Morland and to her heirs for ever my negro woman Sarah and my Negro Girl Nanny with all their Increase. Item I Give and bequeath my said Daughter Mary Morland to my Loving friend Jane Hunniford the wife of Hugh Hunniford until she comes to the age of Eighteen Years or married And it is my will and desire that my said friend Jane Hunniford have the Labour of my said Negro Sarah and Nanny until my said Daughter Mary comes to the age of Eighteen Years or married which shall first happen towards the maintenance and Education of my said Daughter Mary.

Item

I Give and bequeath all this my plantation and Land wherein I now live Situate in Lowes Creek Parish in Surry County Containing two hundred and seven ty five Acres more or less to my Loving wife Elizabeth during her natural life and after her decease I give the said Plantation and Land with the Appurtenances thereunto belonging to my two daughters Mary Morland and Lucy Morland and to the heirs of their bodies Lawfully begotten for ever to be equally divided between them.

Item

My Will and desire is that my three Negroes viz Sam Mary and Jack be appraised in money and what they are appraised to the one half thereof I Give and bequeath to my Loving wife Elizabeth and her heirs for ever and the other half as they are appraised to I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Morland and to her heirs for ever.

Item

All the Cash and Remainder of my Estate of what nature soever and where soever I desire may be appraised in money and what it is appraised to after my Debts and Legacies are paid I Give and bequeath to be equally divided amongst my Wife and two daughters Mary Morland and Lucy Morland and to their heirs for ever.

Item

I Do hereby Ordain constitute and appoint my Loving wife Elizabeth my whole and sole executrix of this my Last Will and Testament hereby making null and void all former Wills by me made in and do declare this to be my Last Will and Testament. **In Testimony** of all which I have herein to put my hand & seal this 9th day of July 1725
