in Vag<sup>ty</sup> being very sick and weak in body but of Reasonable Sense and memory all Paine and praise be given unto Almighty God do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner following First and principally and far above all worldly things and Enjoyments I Commit my Soul to Almighty God trusting and firmly believing through the merits and better passion of my alone Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and Remission of all my Sins here committed when Ever this mortall Life shall cease. And my body I commit from whence it was taken to be decently Entered after the manner of Christian buriall as of discretion of my Ex<sup>ors</sup> hereafter named. And for what worldly goods or Estate it hath been pleased God to bestow on me after my Debts and funerall Expences are defrayed I give and dispose of as followeth

I Give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Tarrett and to the heirs of his body for Ever all that part of my Land lying of the upper side of the Ready branch above my plantation wheron I now live and if my said Son Richard should die without Issue then I Give the aforesaid Land to my Son George Tarrett during his naturall Life and at his decease I Give the aforesaid Land to my two Daughters Martha Tarrett and Mary Tarrett and to the heirs of their bodies for ever to be Equally divided between them

I Give and bequeath unto my Son George Tarrett that Land and plantation wheron the said George now lives at Blackwater during his naturall Life and after his decease I Give the said Land & plantation

plantation to my Daughter Martha Jarrett and to her heirs for Ever, but my Will and devise is that my Son Rich<sup>d</sup> should have free Liberty to fell and carry off any timber on the said Land at Blackwater before mentioned for the use of his own plantation before given him.

I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Mary this my plantation wherupon I now live and all the Land of the Lower side the Reddy branch during his natural Life and at her decease I give and bequeath the said plantation & Land to my Son Richard Jarrett and to the heirs of his body for ever, and for want of such heirs to my Son George Jarrett during his natural Life and after his decease, to my two Daughters and to the heirs of their body for ever to be Equally divided between them.

Item,

I give and bequeath the Labour of my Negro Jack to my Loving wife during her natural Life or widowhood and after her death or marriage which shall first happen, I give the Labour of the said Negro to my Son George Jarrett for the Space of two years and afterwards I give the said Negro to my Son Richard for Ever, but if my said Son Richard should be dead before the said Negro comes to him and leave no Child then my will & devise is that the said Negro be sold by the Sheriff of the County at publick Auction and the money he fetches Equally divided between my two daughters Martha & Mary in three parts.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha, one new feather bed and furniture,

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary one new feather bed and furniture,

I give and bequeath unto my Son George Jarrett fifteen wunable calves of five months old

I give and bequeath all the Rest and Remainder of my Estate, to be of what nature of quality soever to be Equally divided between my wife and Children, Each of them to have an Equall part w<sup>th</sup> the rest

I do hereby make ordain and appoint my Loving wife Mary and my Son Richard my whole and sole Ex<sup>ors</sup> and make void all wills heretofore by me made and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament.
