Item I Give and bequeath to my Grandson Charles Champion one new feather bed a new Rug and a new pair of Chenbris Sheets and my Long Gunn

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son in Law Benjamin Champion all my wearing Apparell

Item I Give and bequeath to the Child my wife is now with Child with let it be either boy or girl and to the heirs of its body for ever all that my parcell of Land Containing one hundred Acres lying and being in the Parish of Lannes Creek in the County of Surry and if the aforesaid Child that my wife now goes with should dye without such issue then I Give and bequeath the Land aforesaid to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Champion and to the heirs of her body for ever

Item I Give and bequeath all the Rest and Remainder of my Estate both Real and Personal and of what nature or kind soever either here in Virginia England or any where else to be Equally divided between my Loving wife Elizabeth and the Child she now is with Child with let it be Boy or Girl

Item I do hereby Ordain Constitute and appoint my Loving wife Elizabeth my whole and Sole Executrix and make all Wills heretofore by me made to be null and void and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament In Testimony whereof which I do hereunto set my hand and fix my Seal this fourteenth Day of December One Thousand Seven hundred & twenty Signed Sealed & declared to be the Last Will and The Words
