Itt. I give to my brother William Thompson my Stock of Cattle that is now under his Care and my Gun called bearley and my musket that is at Maherin -

Itt. My Will and desire is that my wife have the profits of my Land and Stock that is at Maherin during her life that is to have beef and pork for her necessary Occasion but not to take the Stock of from the Land no other ways to dispose of it but for her necessary household provision and if there should happen to be more then my brother to have a part of it

Itt. I nominate, Constitute and appoint my Loving wife Mary Thompson and my Loving brother William Thompson hole and Sole Execut^r and Execut^r of this my Last Will and Testament making Null and Void all other Will or Wills by me formerly made As ~~Witness~~ my hand and Seal this twentieth day of September 1720
