of a certaine Tract or Parcell of Land situate and lying in Surry County containing one hundred and fiftie
where the said George Morrell late dwelt on himselfe both in his heire for ever and doe in
the Presents of this Persones Willingnes of my own free Will by my Attorney above named freely Exhortate
quit and discharge for ever the said Humphry Morrell his heire & others for ever from of my thys
of the said tract or parcell of Land Thairunto belittell my hand and seal this 13 day of Aprill 1728.

In the Name of God Edward Pinnington of Surry County and Biggins Creek Parish being very
sick & weak in body of Parke since and memory thanks be given to Almighty God for it him to
give and bequeave my soul into the hands of Almighty God in Sure and certain hope of Intercession from
the dear through the Merits and Mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ and my body for to be entomb'd
in the Earth in a decent manner according to the Rules of the Church of England —

I give and bequeave unto my son Edward Pinnington the Land and Plantation whar I now Dwelt with
two hundred and Thirtie acres of land more or less to him and his heirs for ever Beginning at
the Mouth of the Pasture Branch at a Marked Goom tree thence running down the Weares course of the
Swamp to the Mouth of Wyches Swamp Branch thence running up the branch unto a certain
pine tree thence crossing to the Place whar it first begane the Mother of the said枝 is to have
her Natrall life or Widewhood on the said Land and Plantation —

I give and bequeave unto my son John Pinnington two hundred and thirty acres of land more or less bounded
as followeth Beginning at the Mouth of the Sugen branch at a great pine tree thence up the said branch to a
Mapall tree from thence to a Lighwood tree thence Eastward to a pine tree in Wyches Branch thence
down the S. Branch to a certain Marked pine tree thence along a line of Marked trees to the Hunting
Quarter, thence to the Hopen Branch. I give the said Land unto my son John Pinnington and his heirs
for ever —

I give and bequeave unto my son Simon Pinnington all the remainder part of my Land lying between Edward
and John it being for two hundred and thirty acres of land more or less to him and his heirs for ever —

I give and bequeave unto my loving wife one Negroe name Peter Durina her Natrall life or Widewhood
and all the remainder of my Estate for to be equally divided Amongst my beloved wife and children
when my Debts and funerall charges are paid. — November the twentieth in the year of our
Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven. —
