of a certain Tract or Parcel of Land situateing and lying in Surry County containing one hundred and fifty
where the said George Morrell did dwell on himself to W^m Balls of Surry County and his heirs for ever and doe in
the Presents of these Persons Voluntary of my own free Will by my Attorney above named freely & honorably
Quit and discharge for ever the said W^m Balls of Surry County his heirs &c. & Mine for ever from of my thirds
of the said Tract or Parcel of Land ^{or any part or Part thereof or any thing Pertaining} their untold Willness my hand and seal this 13th day of April 1728.

In the Name of God, Edward Pinington of Surry County and Virginia being very
sick & weak in body but of perfect voice and memory thanks be given to Almighty God for it. I
give and bequeave my soul into the hands of Almighty God in Sure and Certain hopes of a Resurrection from
the dead through the Merits and Mediation of Our Lord Jesus Christ and my body to be buried
in the earth in a Decent manner according to the Rules of the Church of England. —

I give and bequeave unto myself Edward Pinington the Land and plantation whar Snow Dwelt with
two hundred and thirty Achers of Land more or less to him and his heirs for ever Beginning at
the Mouth of the Pasture Branch at a Marked Gloom tree thence running down the Weares courses of the
S^d Swamp to the Mouth of Wyches Swampe Branch thence running up the branch unto a certain
Pine tree thence crossing to the Place whar it first bequene the Matter of the said See is to have
har Matrall life or Widowhood on the said Land and plantation. —

I give and bequeave unto my son John Pinington two hundred and thirty Achers of Land more or less bounded
as followeth Beginning at the Mouth of the Ingen branch at a great Pine tree thence up the said branch to a
Mapall tree thence to a Sighwood Post thence Eastward to a Pine tree in Wyches Branch thence
down the S^d Branch to a certain Marked Pine tree thence along a line of Marked trees to the Hunting
Quarter Swamp to the Argpen Branch. I give the said Land unto my son John Pinington and his heirs
for ever. —

I give and bequeave unto my son Edmon Pinington all the Remainer part of my Land lying between Edward
and John it being for two hundred and thirty Achers of Land more or less to him and his heirs for ever. —

I give and bequeave unto my Loving Wife one Negro name Peter Durvina har Matrall life or Widowhood
and all the Remainer of my Estate for to be Equally Divided amongst my Beloved Wife and Children
when my Debts and Jerrarall Charges are paid. — November the twentieth in the year of Our
Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred and twenty seven. —
