This Indenture made the Fourth day of July in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred Twenty two Between James Binford of the Parish of Martins Brandon in the County of Prince George Planter of the one part, and Nathaniel Harrison of Southwark Parish in the County of Surrey Leguee of the Other Part Witnesseth that the said James Binford for and in Consideration of the sum of five Shillings to him in hand paid The Receipt where of he doth hereby Acknowledge, and hereof doth Acquit and Discharge the said Nathaniel Harrison, his Executors, Administrators and Assigns hath bargained and Sold And doth by these presents Bargain and Sell unto the said Nathaniel Harrison his Executors, Administrators and Assigns A Certain Tract or parcel of Land with the Appurtenances thereof Situate lying and being in the Parish of Lemnes Creek in the County of Surrey aforesaid, on the Easternmost or Lower Side of the Three Creeks, containing by Estimation One hundred and fifty Acres be the same more or less, bounded as followeth. (that is to say) Beginning at a Red Oak, upon the Creeks Side a little above a Small bottom, thence East ninety four pole to a Gum, then South One hundred and Seventy four pole to a Pine, then South twenty degrees East Seventy two pole to a Hickory then West One hundred and four pole to a Red Oak by the Side of the Three Creeks aforesaid and up the various Courses of the run of the said Creeks to the beginning According to a Patent granting this Land unto the said James Binford bearing date the twenty Third day of March One Thousand Seven hundred and fifteen.
