I Elizabeth Nevill of Larnes Church parish in the County of Surry being indisposed of body but of sound and dis-
posing mind and memory all praise be given to Almighty God therefore do make and ordain this my last Will & testa-
ment in manner following (Viz)

Imp^t First and principally I commit my soul to God the father of Spirits trusting and firmly believing thro the merits
and better passion of my alone Saviour and redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and remission of all my
Tres when ever this mortall Life shall cease and for what worldly Estate it hath pleased the Lord to bestow
upon me after my debts and funerall Charges defrayed I give bequeath and dispose thereof as followeth.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Price for and during her naturall Life y^e plantation
I now live on containing Eighty Six and a half Acres provided the same and all that belongs thereto
be kept in good repair during her life and upon the neglect thereof my Will and desire is that my Execu^r
hereafter named take the same into their possession for the benefit of him or her that shall live to enjoy y^e
same and from and immediately after my said daughters decease I give and bequeath the said Land
to my Grandson W^m Edwards and to the heirs of his body Lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such
issue I give the said Land to my grand daughter Elizth Edwards and to be the heirs of her body lawfully
to be begotten, and for want of such issue I give the said Land to my Grandson Nevill Edwards and
to his heirs for Ever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grandson Nevill Drew and to the heirs of his body Lawfully to be begotten, the
plantation Martin Johnson now lives upon containing Eighty Six and a half Acres but for want of
such issue I give the said Land to my grand daughter Elizabeth Edwards and to her heirs for Ever.

Item, I give to W^m Nevill Edwards the son of Nevill Edwards my Negro boy Joseph.

Item, I give unto Griffin Windum Six hundred and thirty pounds of Tobacco.

Item, I give unto my two daughters Elizabeth and Frances twenty one pounds one Shilling & eleven pence
to be equally divided between them provided they give a discharge to my Grandson Tho^s Edwards that
they never will trouble my Executors for a Legacy left them by my husband W^m Nevill being for the
same Summe in W^m Ball's hands in England and my desire is they enjoy the Legacy left them
by my husband if they can recover it of W^m Ball.

Item, I give unto my Grandson W^m Edwards the bed Tyeon, one rug and what else belongs to y^e Bed
My Will and desire is (after my debts and funerall dispenes discharged) that the one half of my
Estate be equally divided between my daughter Elizth and her Children and that the other half
be equally divided between my daughter Frances and her Children.

Therby constitute and appoint my Son in Law Edward Drew and my grandson Tho^s Edwards Ex^{rs}
of this my Last Will and Testament In Testimony of all which I have hereunto put my hand
and Seal this 2^d day of August Anno Domⁱ 1719

In the Name of God Amen I William Gray of Surry County being very weak in body
but of perfect Sense and memory thanks be given to Almighty God therefore do make and enact this my
Last Will and Testament in manner as followeth

- First I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator and Jesus Christ my Redeemer fully trust-
ing on his merits for the remission of all my Sins and for what Estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me
in this Life I do dispose of as is hereafter Express
- Secondly I bequeath to my Son William Gray the plantation wherein Thomas Lockhart lately lived and the
plantation wherein Thomas Mathews lately lived and the plantation wherein John Lock now li-
veth with all the Land belonging to the three plantations outwards, as far as a bottom called wixes bot-
tom with a direct Line of mark^t Trees from Robert Snipes his Spring run up the said wixes bottom
untill it meet with a Line of mark^t Trees and along that line untill it joynes to Mr Sam^l Thompson's
Line the said Land containing four hundred and fifty Acres more or less to him and the heirs of his
body Lawfully begotten for Ever
- Thirdly I bequeath to my Son W^m Gray all the Land that belongs to me on the South side the Black-water
Road that was formerly Balbeing four hundred and Sixty Acres more or less to him & his heirs
and assigns for Ever
- Fourthly I bequeath to my Son Gilbert Gray the plantation wherein I now live and the plantation wherein
Rob^t Snipes now liveth and a plantation wherein Thomas Rose now liveth called Rogers with
five hundred and fifty Acres of Land belonging to the three plantations more or less to him and the
heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for Ever
- Fifthly It is my Will that if my Son Gilbert Gray shall (as pray God defend) happen to die without an heir Law-
fully begotten of his own body that then these three plantations above mentioned with the five hundred and
thirty Acres of Land more or less shall be equally divided between my Son William Gray's four Sons (viz)
W^m Gray, Robert Gray, Joseph Gray, and Thomas Gray, to them and to the heirs of their body Lawfully
begotten for Ever
- Sixthly I bequeath to my Son Gilbert Gray all the Land on the North side the Black-water Road formerly called Balbe
containing three hundred and Sixty Acres more or less to him and his heirs and assigns for Ever
- Seventhly I bequeath to my Son Gilbert Gray a Negro Girl called Flee to him and his heirs for Ever and also the Rent of
the plantation wherein John Lock lives for this year
- Eighthly I bequeath to my daughter Mary Gray one new feather bed and bolster, and a new Rugg and new pair of Blankets
and a pair of Course Sheets and a pillow and two pots one called black pot and the other called Maltie and one
Iron pot and pot hooks of about five or six Gallons and six pewter dishes and six plates and of the great
basens and a Chamber pot and one Tankard and one young black mare and a Col^d called Jenny
- Ninthly I bequeath to my daughter Picilla Gray one new feather bed and bolster a new Rug a new ff^t of Blankets and a
pair of Course Sheets and a pillow and two pots one called Lady and the other called pitty and a young gray
horse called by the name of Dragon and one Iron pot of about five or six Gallons and pot hooks and six pewter
dishes and six plates and a great basin and a Chamber pot and one Tankard
- Tenthly I bequeath to my daughter Faith Puffin a warming pan and a brass Chafin Dish
- Eleventhly I bequeath to my Grandson W^m Andrews a black Year old heffer
- Twelfthly I bequeath to my Grand Daughter Eliz^a Edwards a year old Red pite heffer
- Thirteenthly I bequeath to my Grand Son Will^m Gray one Large Silver Salt for mark^t with WG on the Edge
- Fourteenthly I bequeath to my Grand Son Will^m Puffin one Ewe and two Lambs
- Fifteenthly I bequeath all the rest of my Estate after my Just Debts are paid unto my Son Gilbert Gray and it
is my Will that he pay unto his two Sisters above mentioned new Dishes and new basens
- Sixteenthly I desire my Son Will^m Gray to have an Over Sight in seeing my will performed
- Seventeenthly I make and ordain my Son Gilbert Gray my full and sole Executor of this my Last will According
