Vir First and Principally I Commit my Soul to Almighty God and for what worldly Estate it hath pleased the Lord of his great mercy to bestow upon me I give and Dispose thereof as followeth —

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Taylor and to his heirs for ever my Plantation lying upon the Stratink Swamp by me purchased of the Trustees of the Estate of Joseph John Jackson Deceased with all the Land lying upon the same side of Cohers branch

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Taylor all my Land lying upon the other side of the said Cohers branch next adjoining to James Rixtons and Samuel Cornwells Land to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Othelred Taylor all my land lying upon the Lightwood Swamp to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give unto my son William and to his heirs forever the land purchased by me of Joseph And John High if it shall be thought most advisable to have new Deeds drawn in his name and acknowledged to him I desire it may be done at the Cost of my Estate —

Item I give unto my Dear wife Elizabeth the Labour of my Malatto Man Jack also the same of my Negro Woman Lucy for and During her naturall Life and immediately after her Decease my Will and Desire is that they be both sold to the best advantage and the money raised thereby to be Equally Divided between such of my Children as shall be then Living: Provided that my Negro Girl Crab be not recovered by any from my Estate but if she should my Will and Desire is that my son Othelred have Twenty two pounds of the money the said Slaves are sold for and the remainder to be Divided as before mentioned —

Item I give unto my said Wife her riding horse and side Saddle —

Item I give unto my son Samuel my Negro boy Sampson and my Negro Girl Frank provided that if they both Live untill he arrives to the age of twenty one years that he pays unto his Brother Othelred Fourteen pounds Current money —

Item I give unto my son Henry my Negro boys Will and Guy provided that if they both Live until he arrives to the age of twenty one years that he pays unto my son William Six pounds Current money —

Item I give unto my son Othelred my negro girl Crab and fourteen pounds to be paid him by my son Samuel provided both his Negroes Live untill he arrives to the age of twenty one years I further give unto my said son Othelred fourteen pounds Current money — My Will and Desire is that the two Houses at Stratink be finished with all Expedition at the Charge of my Estate —

Item I give unto my son William my negro boy Frank and say pawns to be paid him by my son Henry provided both his Negroes
 Item I give unto the age of twenty one years I also give my said son William my Negro Girl Katherine
 Item I give unto my Brothers Samuel and John and my Sister Rebecca twenty shillings to each to buy them a ring
 Item I give unto John Clements two breeding cows
 Item I give unto John Clark Junr two ditto
 Item I give unto my Loving wife and four Sons Samuel Henry Theodor and William all the rest and remainder of my Estate
 of what nature kind property or quality whatsoever it be To be Equally Divided between them or the Survivors of them
