In the Name of God Amen I Francis Clements of Surry County being sick &  
weak in body but of perfect Sense of Memory Thanks be given to Almighty God therefore do  
make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth  
First and principle I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator and Jesus  
Christ my Redeemer fully Trusting in his Merits for Remission of all my Sins and for what  
Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I do dispose of as is hereafter Express  
Second I bequeath unto the Church-wardens and Vestry of South parish in Surry County and their suc-  
cessors for Ever my Plantation and Land call'd and known by the name of Indian spring con-  
taining six hundred and fifty Acres more or less for a Glebe for the said parish the same being  
bought of Maj<sup>r</sup>. Nicholas Merivether by my Father Fra<sup>s</sup>. Clements Deceased provided that  
the said Church-wardens and Vestry doth pay to my Uncle Cap<sup>t</sup>. William Browne or his Order  
Ten pounds Currant money of Virg<sup>a</sup> within nine months after this Date but if they refuse  
to pay the said money unto my said uncle Cap<sup>t</sup>. William Browne Order or then I give & bequeath  
unto my said Uncle Cap<sup>t</sup>. William Browne the aforesaid Plantation or Tract of Land to him  
and his heirs and Assigns for Ever

Third I bequeath to my Loving Uncles Maj<sup>r</sup>. Nich<sup>o</sup>. Merivether and Cap<sup>t</sup>. William Browne to  
each of them a Gold ring of fifteen shillings Value

Fourth I bequeath to my Loving Coy<sup>s</sup>. William David Eliz<sup>th</sup>. Jane Sarah and Mary Merivether  
Children of Maj<sup>r</sup>. Nich<sup>o</sup>. Merivether and to Ann Johnson wife of Thomas Johnson and to  
Jane Walker Mary Eliz<sup>th</sup> and Anne Browne to each of them a gold ring to the Value of ten shillings

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my Brother Benjamin Clements an Entry for fifty Acres of Land that  
lies on the Spring Swamp above my Land to him his heirs and Assigns for Ever. I also give  
him all my wearing Cloaths both Linen and Woolen and my Pistolls holsters and Sword and a  
young mare that is at his house and my saddle and bridle and boots and a gray horse I bought of  
Robert Webb Jun<sup>r</sup> if he can find him he is now strayed from me and my two Largest Sows and  
ten spay'd Sows and barrens but on Consideration of the aboves<sup>d</sup> Legacies if my Mother in  
Law Lydia Clements will Deliver unto my Executor hereafter named a bill which she hath  
under my hand for Eighteen pounds Currant Money Dated the third day of December 1718  
that then my said Brother shall enjoy the aboves<sup>d</sup> Legacies immediately after my Death but  
otherwise I give him nothing and it shall return to my Execut<sup>r</sup>.

Sixthly I Give and bequeath to my brother Thomas Clements my Plantation on the Spring Swamp  
bounded as followeth beginning four hundred yards below my Dwelling house on that branch whereon  
my house stands and so Crossing the neck Parralel with the head line and so up the S. swamp  
and branch unto the said line Containing one hundred and sixteen Acres more or less to him  
and his heirs for Ever and six Cows and Ten Sows and a feather bed and bolster & Bag of Blank  
et c<sup>a</sup> of sheets Three pewter dishes three plates 5 bason 1 Iron pot 1 frying pan six spoons  
to be Delivered him at the Age of Eighteen but in Consideration of the said Legacies if my  
Mother in Law Lydia Clements will Deliver unto my Executor hereafter named a bill  
which she hath under my hand for Eighteen pound Curr. money Dated the third Day of  
December

December 1720 that then my said brother Thomas Clements shall be possessed of the above Legacy at the age of Eighteen Years but other ways I give him nothing and it shall return to my Executor

Seventh I Give and bequeath to my Cousen Henry Browne all my Land on the North side the Spring Swamp and all my Land below my plantation that I have given my brother Thomas Clements Conditionally between the Spring Swamp and the main branch Containing two hundred Acres more or less to him his heirs and Assigns for Ever I also give him my horse I bought of him last

Eighth I Give and bequeath unto my Cousen William Browne Junr all the rest of my Estate both Real and Personall after my Just Debts and Legaces are paid Including the Legacy given me by my Father to him and his heirs for Ever

Lastly I nominate and appoint my Loving Cousen William Browne Junr my full and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament Revoking all former Wills In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal this Eighth day of April 1721
