Item. I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten all that part of Land lying on the upper side the reedy branch it being part of the Tract whereon my Father lived and I Give to my daughter Martha four Dishes four plates and four porringers and a good feather bed and furniture.

Item. All the rest of my Estate of what kind or quality soever I Give and bequeath to my Loving wife Elizabeth making her my whole and Sole Execut<sup>r</sup> of this my Last Will and Testam<sup>t</sup>. In Testimony whereof I have set my hand and Seal.
