behind my two Daughters Prissata and Elisabeth and in case that either of them Dye before they come to Age y^e other may Enjoy both Parts and in case they both dye before they come to Age then my Desire is if it may be Equally Divided behind my two Sisters Children Elisabeth Tayners and Grace Whorrens And I do Ordain James Wilson and James Pyland to be my sole and sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament fully Renouncing all former Wills that shall be Produced do fully settle and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament as Witnesses hereunto I have set my hand and fixed my seal this 23 day of Aprill in y^e year of Our Lord 1727
