Issue to the Oldest surviving Brother or his heirs male if any such

I give and bequeath to my Son Howell Edmunds that tract of Land on Blunks Swamp in the  
Isle of Wight County together with all the Stock belonging thereto and also the Debts due to  
me from Thos: Saul and George Wood and three hundred Acres of Land at the great risk to them  
and his heires and in case of failure of Issue to the Oldest surviving brother or his heirs Male

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Item, give unto the Negro named Peter and a bed and furniture and twenty five Pounds Current money of Virginia  
Item, Bequeath to my Son, Nicholas Edmunds five hundred Acres of Land upon the great Creek in the said County  
his first choice with all the Stocks thereunto belonging or any wife appertaining and also a bed & furniture  
likewise two Negroes (to Will) George and Sarah, the Land to be in the same manner as aforesaid

Item, Give to my Daughter Sarah Jones One Peculiar to buy a Ring and a Negro Wench called Moll and her increase  
to her and her heirs

Item, Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Edmunds One Negro Woman named Nannie and her two Children with their  
Increase to her and her heirs and her choice (after my Son Thomas) of the best bed & furniture in the house  
and my riding horse called Stockey, after April next and four female cattle not under three nor above six year old

Item, Give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne Edmunds two Negro boys called Biffs and Will and also one bed &  
furniture & four head of female cattle not under three nor exceeding six year old

And further my Will is that whereas there is some rum Sugars and Molasses now by me, that my Children  
that are unmarried & sojourn Endeavour to make the best of it, and Divide the Produce equally amongst them  
And further my Will is that my Stock and Crop be and remain as it is for the support of my Children till they  
are of Age or Marryed

And what remains of my Estate (after my debts and the aforesaid Legacies are paid) I call and personally I
