In the name of God Amen I John Watkins of Surry County being sick and weak in body but of perfect Sense and memory thanks be given to Almighty God therefore do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner as followeth

- First and principally I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator and Jesus Christ my Redeemer fully trusting in his merits for Remission of all my Sins and for what Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I do dispose of as is hereafter Express
- Secondly I Give to my brother Henry Watkins my plantation and all the Land that I have on the South side of that Swamp whereon I now live to him and the heirs of his body for ever
- Thirdly I Give to my brother Robert Watkins soe much out of my Estate to the Value of forty Shillings
- Fourthly I Give the use of my plantation whereon I now live and the Labour of my negro man Roger to my Loving wife Ann during her natall life and after her death I Give the said plantation and Land and negro to my brother Henry Watkins and the heirs of his body for ever and I Give my brother Henry Watkins my Gun
- Fifthly I Give to my Loving wife Ann all the rest of my Estate after my just Debts are paid that is not already given away
- Lastly I make and Ordain my Loving wife Ann my full and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will revoking all former Wills unto which I have hereto set my hand and seal this 12. day of May 1722
