I Isaac Faulcon of Southwark Parrish in the County of Surrey being sick and weak in body but of Reasonable and disposing mind and memory all laud and praise be given to Almighty God. Therefore doe make and Ordain my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say first and principally and far above all Worldly things and Enjoyments I Commit my Soul to God the Father of Spirits trusting and stedfastly believing thro. the Merits and bitter death, and Passion of my alone saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and remission of all my sins when ever this mortal life shall cease and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named, And for what Estate it hath pleased the Lord to Dispose me with after my Debts and Funerall Charges is defrayd I give bequeath and dispose of as follows.

1. It is my Will and desire that my loving Wife have and Enjoy the Plantation whereon I now live wth all the Appurtenances thereto belonging and Priviledge of getting Fencing and fire Timber on any part of the land I now hold, during her Natural life which is to be in full of her dower and of her decease I give and bequeath my said Plantation wth the Appurtenances to my son Nicholas Faulcon and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.
2. I give unto my Dear and loving Wife The Labour of all my Negroes and there Increase during her life and at her Decease.
3. I give unto my son Abraham Faulcon my Negroes Betty and Nanny with their Increase to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.
4. I give unto my son Jacob Faulcon my Negroe Woman Sarra and her Increase and a Negroe boy named Billy to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.
5. I give unto my son Nick^s Faulcon my Negroe man Jerry and my Negroe Girl (Ct) with her Increase to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.
6. I give unto my said son Nick^s all my house hold stuff and Stock of what Nature and kind soever which is now upon the Plantation whereon I live or belonging thereto My Wife having the use of the said Stock and household goods during her life.
7. I give unto my son Abraham the Plantation whereon he now lives to be divided by a straight line from a Spanish Oak by the Main Road to a bottom on the Leadys Swamp and all the land on the West Side that line to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.
8. I give unto my son Jacob the Plantation whereon he now dwells wth all the land on the East Side of my Spring branch to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for Ever.

1. I give the use of my Xeid Saw and Cart among my three sons Abraham, Jacob and Nicholas.
 2. I give unto my son Abraham three barrells Indian corn to be delivered to him at my Death.
 3. I give unto my son Jacob three barrells Indian corn to be delivered to him at my Death.
 4. I give all the rest of my corn to my Wife and son Nicholas Faulcon.
 5. I give unto my said three sons All the New Cotten I have to be equally divided.

This Indenture Made the seventeenth day of April in the Year of Our Lord One thousand &
 seven hundred and twenty seven Between James Judkins of Surry fourthly of the one part and William
 Hancey of the County of Surry Aforesaid of the other part Willne^sse^s that the said James Judkins
 for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings to him in hand Paid the Receipt whereof he doth
 hereby acknowledge and thereof doth acquit and discharge the said William Hancey his Executors
 Administrators and Assigns Nath^l Bargain and sold and doth by these presents Bargain &
 sell unto the said William Hancey his Executors Administrators and Assigns a certain tract or parcel
 of land with the appurtenances thereof situate lying and being on the North side of the little creek
 of the three creeks in the County Aforesaid containing by Estimation two hundred and seventy five
 Acres of land be the same more or less the said two hundred and seventy five Acres of land being
 granted to the said James Judkins by Patent dated the Twenty second day of February One thousand
 seven hundred and twenty four and bounded as followeth Beginning at a White Oak by y^e Side of the
 little creek Aforesaid a Corner of Thomas Jacksons Land thence by Jacksons line North by West One
 hundred and forty two Poles to a White Oak then North fifty six Poles West one hundred and fifty eight
 Poles to a White Oak near the head of a branch then West South West One hundred and eleven Poles to
 a Small White Oak by the side of the little creek Aforesaid and down the various courses of the Run
 of the said creek to the beginning and also the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders
 thereof and of every Part and Parcel thereof To have and to hold the Aforesaid land with
 the appurtenances unto the said William Hancey his Executors Administrators and Assigns from the
 day next before the date hereof unto the End and terme of One Year from thence next ensuing to the
 Intent that by Virtue thereof and of the Statute for transferring uses into Possession the said William
 Hancey may be in the Actual Possession of the said land and be Enabled to take and Accept of a Grant
 and Release of the Premises to him his heirs and Assigns for ever In Willne^sse Whereof the said
 James Judkins hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his Seal the day and year first above
