Also I give unto my Daughter Mary Dickins a gray Mare and all her Increase except the first foal that is raised to one year old and a cow and calf to her & her heirs.

Also to Harlday Dickins give one cow and calf to her and her heirs.

Also I give to my Son James one Mare to him and his heirs.

Also I give to my Son Timfor one Mare branded TD to him and his heirs.

Also I give to my Dear and Ever loving Wife Elizabeth too of the best Breds and all the house stuff during her widowhood and if she marries then equally to be divided amongst my sons.

Item I give and bequeath to my brother Nicholas Faulcon all the rest and remainder of my Estate of what nature kind property or quantity whatsoever.

I hereby constitute and appoint my brother Nicholas Faulcon my sole Exec of this my last will and Testament in Testimony of all which I have herein set my hand and seal this third day of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1727.
