The Condition of this Obligation is such that Whereas the above bound Robert Snipes hath obtained a Licence to keep an ordinary at his Dwelling house near the Court of this County if therefore the said Robert Snipes Doth constantly keep and provide on his said Ordinary good wholesome & Cleanly Lodging and Dyett and Drink according to Law for Travelers and Stabledge, Toller, and provender or pasture and provender as the season shall require for three horses for and During the term of one year from the date hereof and shall not suffer or permit any unlawful gaminge in his house, nor on the Sabbath day suffer any persons to Reple or Drink more than is necessary then this Obligation to be Void & of no Effect otherwise to be and remain in full Power, force and Virtue

Imp^t Give and bequeath my Soul to God that gave it me Relying on the Merits of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to have full Remission of all my Sins at the Last day, and my body to the Earth to be decently Interred at the order of my Ex^{ts} hereafter named,

W^{it} Give and bequeath unto my Son James Stanton, all my housing and Land with all Appurtenances thereunto belonging and Eight pewter plates and one Chafing Dish, and one Large Chest, and one Cuck, and one pewter Dish, and one pair of Sheets, and one Iron Spitt, and Cox Smoothing Iron,

W^{it} Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Stanton One feather bed and bolster with a little Tick and Rugg, two p^{rs} of Sheets, one Dozen of pewter plates, one quart Tankard, three pewter Dishes, & one pewter porringer & one Casson,

W^{it} Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Stanton, three Pewter Dishes one Doz of plates, one Basin, one Feather bed wth Rugg and bolster, One Blankett, Two pair of Sheet, and one quart Tankard, and after all my Just Debts are all payed, then the Remainder of my Estate be Equally divided between my three Children James, Mary, & Ann, Stanton

And further I do hereby Constitute and appoint my Son James Stanton, to be my whole and Sole Ex^{tr} of this my Last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of July One Thousand Seven hundred and Nineteen.
