This Indenture made the fourteenth day of April in the fifth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the faith &c. and in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Nineteen Between Samuell Thompson and Mary his wife of the County of Surry of the one part and James Nichols of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Samuell Thompson & Mary his wife for and in Consideration of the Sum of thirty four pounds Current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said James Nichols the Receipt whereof & themselves therewith fully satisfied contented and paid they doth hereby acknowledge and for divers other good Causes & considerations them hereunto moving hath given granted bargained Sold demised Leased and to farm Letten & by these p^rsents doth give grant bargain Sell demise Lease and to farm Let unto the s^d James Nichols his Executors Administrators and Assigns One certain Tract or Dividend of Land Containing two hundred and Seventy Eight Acres Situate lying and being in the said County of Surry and Bounded as a Patent bearing date the twentieth day of October 1689 well more at Large appears with all Houses, Edifices buildings, barns, yards, Gardens, Orchards, fields, Lands, fences, woods, underwoods, ways, waters, watercourses, swamps, marshes, meadows, pasturage, feedings, and all other profits commodities and advantages whatsoever to the said Tract of two hundred seventy eight acres of Land or any part or parcell thereof belonging or in any wise appertaining together with the privileges and Liberties of Hunting Hawking fishing fowling To have and to hold the said demised p^rmisses unto the said James Nichols his Ex^r Adm^r and Assignes from the day of The date hereof for and during the full term of three Years to be fully compleated and ended yeildng & paying therefore yearly on the Tenth day of November to the said Samuell Thompson & Mary his wife their heirs and Assignes one grain of Indian Corn if it be lawfully demanded upon the premises to the intent and purpose that by Virtue of these p^rsents and of the Statue for transferring uses into possession the said James Nichols may be in actual and peaceable possession of the premises before granted and may be thereby the better Enabled to accept of a grant or Conveyance of y^e Reversion and Inheritance thereof to him & his heirs for ever In Witness whereof the said Samuel Thompson and Mary his wife hath hereunto set there hands & seals the day
