Item — I give unto my Son Micajah one Pewter Tankard and a pair of bellows and my midlin Chest and my Long Gun and one iron pot and a frying pan —

Item — I give to my Daughter Elizabeth three Pewter plates and two Pewter Dishes —

Item — I give to my Daughter Joannah my Spice Morter and Pestle and my Brass Skillet —

Item — I give to my loving wife Phillis my two Brass Kettles and a feather bed and all the furniture that belongs to it —

Item — My Will and Desire is that the rest of my Estate be Equally Devideed between my wife and my three Children after my just debts be paid —

Item — My Will and Desire is that all my Debts be well and truly paid by my Executrix out of my Estate before Devision be made —

The Condition of this obligation is such that Whereas the above bound John Simmons is by Commission from the Hon Alexander Spotswood Esq: appointed Sheriff of Surrey County during pleasure. Now if the said John Simmons shall well and truly duly and faithfully by himself and such Officer and Officers as shall be by him nominated and appointed and thereunto sworn execute all Warrants Proclamations or process as shall come to him or them from the Governor for the time being the President and Council and Comit in cheif or any of the Council and be very Diligent in finding out the true Quantity of Land held in the said County by any person or persons whatsoever and return a true and perfect List or rent role of the same to his Majestys Auditor of this Country upon oath at such time and place as he shall appoint also render unto him a particular perfect and full Account of all his Majestys Revenues and Dues in the said County during the time of his Presidency and also that he shall due payment make of all such Publick Dues as shall be levied in the aforesaid County of Surrey unto the severall persons as shall be appointed to receive the same and full performance make of all things belonging to the Office of Sheriff of the aforesaid County of Surrey. Then this obligation to be void or else to stand be and remain in full power force and Virtue —
