- Item I Devise that all my just Debts and funerall expences be first paid and allowed
- Item I Give and Devise unto my Loving Granddaughter Mary Vinson One Mare already delivered and to her beloved Child Thomas a Colt Delivered with the said mare before mentioned
- Item I Give and Devise unto my Loving Gran Children in General one Shilling a piece
- Item I Give and Devise unto my Loving Son John Dobe Tenth the Land which he now dwells upon during his Life on the South side of the Merry Meadow containing two hundred Acres more or less and at the hour of his Death two his Eldest Son John Dobe Meane and to his heirs
- Item I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Son Robert the Land which I now live upon and to his heirs on the South side of the Merry Meadow containing two hundred Acres more or less

I Desire that all the rest of my Estate not before Given and bequeathed may be possess by by Loving
Son Robert Dobe and to his own proper Estate to go therewith as he pleases whom I likewise Constitute
and appoint Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament by me heretofore made and this
and no other to be my Last Will and Testament In Testimony whereof I have this 19th Day of March
in the Year of our Lord God One thousand Seven hundred and Sixteen. Seventeen. Set my hand and
affixed my Seal.

for the Valuable Consideration of Seventy One pounds Current money on hand paid do bargain Sell and
Deliver unto William Gray of the Same County six negro Slaves known and calld by the names of James,
Tom, Horton, Sambo, Betty and Fothery with all their Increase which said negro Slaves I do Warrant
the Sale to the said William Gray his heirs Executors, Administrators or Assigns against me or my heirs
Executors, Administrators or any other person or persons Claim, or Claims whatsoever. And it is further
Concluded and agreed on that if the said William Thompson, his heirs Executors, Administrators do well
and truly pay the said William Gray or his Assigns the full and just Sum of Seventy one pounds Current
money and the Lawfull Interest of six p Cent p Annum Arising thereon some time within three years
after the Date hereof that then the said William Thompson his heirs & shall have all the abovesaid negroes
that shall be then Living according to the true Intent and meaning hereof any thing herein Contained
