This Indenture made the Tenth day of May in the third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and in the year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven hundred and Seventeen Between John Freeman Sen<sup>r</sup> of Surry County of the one part and John Mitchell of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that he the said John Freeman for and in Consideration of the sume of ten pounds Current money to him in hand paid at and before the Unsealing and Delivery of these presents by the said John Mitchell the receipt whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof by these presents doth acquitt and Discharge the said John Mitchell his Heirs Execut<sup>s</sup> and Administrators have granted Released and Conformed and by these presents doth for himself and his Heirs fully Clearly and absolutely grant Release and Conform unto the said John Mitchell his Heirs and Assigns for ever one hundred Acres of Land situate lying and being on the North side of Notaway river in the County aforesaid bounded N<sup>th</sup> beginning at a marked Tree at the said River according to the plat therof thence West Thirtly seven poles to a Red oak thence South fourteen Degrees West Thirtly six poles to two live oaks thence West Thirtly nine Degrees North Seventy five poles to a Red oak thence South nineteen Degrees West one hundred & fifteen poles to a hickory thence South Twenty one Degrees West one hundred and Thirtly poles to a corner hickory Tree between the said Mitchell and Isaac Hall thence East Thirty Degrees South or there about along a line of marked Trees to a corner hickory Tree standing at the said River thence down the main river as it trends to the begining first before mentioned including the Island against the said Mitchells house in the said one hundred Acres of Land be it more or less together with all houses buildings fenceings orchards gardens and also all ways waters woods proffitts Comodities advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging and all the Estate Right Title use Interest Inheritance possession reversion claim and Demand of the said John Freeman of in or to the said Land & premises hereby granted the said John Mitchell and is now in his full possession and Seizin by Virtue of a bargain and Sale therof to him made by the said John Freeman for the Term of three years to commence from the Ninth day of this Instant by Indenture bearing Date the day before the date of these presents by force and Virtue of the Statute for Transferring uses into possession To have and to Hold the said Land Tenments & premises with the appurtenances hereby granted and released unto the said John Mitchell his heirs and Assigns for ever so that neither the said John Freeman nor his Heirs nor any person under them shall have any Claim or Demand any Right Title or Interest of in or to the premises or any part thereof but that the same shall and may be Quietly and peaceably possessed and Enjoyed by the said John Mitchell his heirs and Assigns for ever In Witness whereof the said John Freeman hath hereunto Sett his hand and Seal the day and year first above Written

In the Name of God Amen I Francis Sowerby of Southwark Parish in the County of Surry being very sick and weak in body but thanks be to Almighty God of sound and perfect mind and memory Prae-  
re we be therefore to Almighty God to make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following that is to say first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Al-  
mighty God hoping through the merrits Death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full  
and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to Inherit Everlasting Life and my body I committ  
to the Earth to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named and as Touch-  
ing the Disposisiion of such Temporall Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give and  
dispose therof as followeth) first my Will is that all my Debts and further all charges shall be paid  
and Discharged.

Item I give unto my Son Francis Sowerby and his Heirs for ever my old plantation where my father  
formerly lived with all houses and orchards and other Emoluments thereto belonging from a Red oak  
marked Tree in the Line that divides my Land and Thomas Colliers Land thence down a bottom  
Southwardly to a Run thence down the Run Eastward to the mouth of a branch commonly known  
by the name of the popler branch thence up the branch to a marked popler that grows in the Line be-  
tween me and Regans Land and so along the severall Lines round that plantation to the  
first Nation my will is that my loving wife Mary Sowerby shall have the profit of half  
the fruit Trees growing upon the plantation during her Natural Life Item I give unto my Son  
Francis Sowerby the bed that goes by the Name of his bed and all the furniture belonging to the  
the said bed and three head of Cattle called by the Name of his Cattle and my carbine belt and sword  
and sword and as much Timber of any part of the whole Devedend a Land I now hold as will  
bid him the first house he builds and if the selfe be dead that is already given him then I give him  
the selfe that now sutes the mare and one sow marked of his mark.

Item my will is that my Loven wife Mary Shall have the use of the plantation I now live on making no  
wast of Timber nor sellen Timber of the Land till my son William Sowerby comes to the Age of  
Twenty one years and then my will is that my Loven wife shall have one Third of my plantation during  
her natural Life

Item I give unto my Son William Sowerby my plantation I now live on including all the houses orchards and  
Land belonging to me in this whole Devedend Accept that part I give to my Son Francis to my Son  
William Sowerby and his Heirs for ever and to have the possession Twenty one years old

Item I give to my Loven wife Mary Sowerby one feather bed and furniture

Item I give to my Son William Sowerby one feather bed and furniture

Item my will is that the remainer part of my Estate be equally Devided between my Son William and my  
Loven wife Mary

Item my will is that my Right to that Land called by the Name of Larenco at Johnshochan and that Land  
at ware neck be sold and the money or Job it sells for to goe towards paying my debts

Item I do appoint my Loven wife Mary Sowerby my whols and sole Exec to see this Last Will and Testa-  
ment performed In witness whereof I have putt my hand and Seal This 12 Day of September in  
1716
