Bequeath to my Son Nicholas Edmunds five hundred Acres of Land upon the great Creek in the said County
his first choice with all the Stocks thereunto belonging or any wife appertaining and also a bed & furniture
likewise two Negroes (to Will) George and Sarah, the Land to be in the same manner as aforesaid

Item, Give to my Daughter Sarah Jones One Peculiar to buy a Ring and a Negro Wench called Moll and her increase
to her and her heirs

Item, Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Edmunds One Negro Woman named Nannie and her two Children with their
Increase to her and her heirs and her choice (after my Son Thomas) of the best bed & furniture in the house
and my riding horse called Stockey after April next and four female cattle not under three nor above six year old

Item, Give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne Edmunds two Negro boys called Biff and Will and also one bed &
furniture & four head of female cattle not under three nor exceeding six year old

And further my Will is that whereas there is some rum Sugars and Molasses now by me that my Children
that are unmarried & sojourn Endeavour to make the best of it and Divide the Produce equally amongst them
And further my Will is that my Stock and Crop be and remain as it is for the support of my Children till they
are of Age or Marryed

And what remains of my Estate (after my debts and the aforesaid Legacies are paid) I call and personally I
give to my Son Thomas Edmunds and his heirs and I also do Appoint him to be my Whole and sole Executor of
this my last Will & Testament Witness my hand and Seal this 24th day of December 1728.

mind and memory thanks be to the Almighty God, and calling to mind the uncertain State of this transi-
tory life and that all flesh must yield unto death when it shall please God to call me and Ordain
this my last Will & Testament in manner & forme as followeth.

Item, I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Saviour Jesus Christ in whom alone I trust to
be assuredly saved and for my body I committ it to the earth to be decently interred at the Disposition
of my Executrix hereafter named and for my temporal Estate I give devise and dispose of the same in my
forme following

Item, I desire that all my just Debts and funerall Expences be first paid and allowed

Item, I give and Devise unto my Son Robert Hicks and his heirs for ever the tract of Land I now live on
and my wearing clothes, and my Will and desire is that my Son Robert shall go and live with my Son
in Law Edward'satum until he comes to be at the age of eighteen Years

Item, I give and Devise unto my two Sons John Hicks and Daniel Hicks and their heirs for ever my tract
of Land

of Land which I took up on Stephen's branch in Brunswick fairly to be Equally Divided between them,
and my Will and desire is that my son John shall go and live with my Son in Law John Rose until he comes
to be at the Age of eighteen Years.

I give unto my son Joshua Hicks my great Copper Kettle.

And all the rest of my Estate wheresoever I give unto my Loving Wife Rebekah Hicks and I do Appoint her sole
Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and her Brother George Reeves Executor with her; and I revoke
all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made and this and no other to be my last Will & Testament.
In testimony whereof I have this last day of September in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred
and twenty eight, set my hand and affixed my Seal.
