In the Name of God Amen John Oliver of Southwark Parish in Surrey County being very Sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God therefore and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain my Last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me withall in this Life I give devise and dispose of the same as followeth in manner to wit I Give and bequeath unto my Lawfull wife Mary Oliver all and singular and every part and parcel of all my Goods and Chattels Moveables and Immoveables by her freely to be possessed and enjoyed and to whom I leave unto make and Ordain my only and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and as hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul every other former Testament and Will Legacy Bequest or Bequest by me in any way before this time made Will and bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament.

The above mentioned Will of John Oliver last thus presented by Mary Oliver Executrix thereof who made Oath there to (and gave bond with Security according to Law) and being proved by the Oaths of Alexander Chisnall and William Tomlinson Witnesses thereto the same is ordered to be recorded and is recorded by

To all Christian People

to whom these presents shall come I William Richardson of the Isle Wight County and Greeting Know Ye That I William Richardson for and in consideration of the Love good will and affection which I have and do bear towards my Loving Friend William Athison of Surrey County have given and granted and by these presents do fully freely clearly and absolutely give and grant to the said William Athison his heirs and Assigns one certain piece and parcel of Land Situate and being in the South Side of the Main Swamp of the Black Water in the County of Surrey and in the East Side of a branch called Georgys branch (it being part of a parcel of Land granted to the said William Richardson by Patent for three hundred Acres and dated the 5th day of September Anno Domini 1723) beginning at the said Richardsons his line where it crosses Georgys branch and so along that same line about fifteen pole to a marked Tree then along the same line North East One hundred and sixty four pole to a black Oak sapling then South seventy five degrees East 80 pole to a red Oak then South by East about twenty pole to a live Oak in the head of a branch proceeding from the said Georgys branch then down the said branch to a marked Gum in the mouth of the said branch then up the said Georgys branch to the first Station containing one hundred and five Acres (more or less) it being the Land and Plantation whereon the said William Athison now dwelleth on / Together with all the right title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever which I now have or which any or either of my heirs Executors or Assigns may hereafter have of or in the said granted Premises or any part thereof

Have and to hold

the said Land unto him the said William Athison his heirs and Assigns for ever absolutely without any manner of Condition as the said William Richardson have fully freely and absolutely and of my own accord let and put in further Testimony In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this sixteenth day of November Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and twenty five

to whom these presents shall come Now know ye that I Robert Athison of the Parish of Saint Giles in Surrey County for divers good Cause and Considerations but more especially for the Natural Love and Affection which I bear unto my well beloved Brother in Law Thomas Lyle of the aforesaid Parish and County do Give and Convey unto the said Thomas Lyle and in and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Thomas Lyle one certain Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the lower Part of Surrey County beginning in the fork of a branch running up the main branch and up a small branch that comes out of the main branch to the left and along the line to the main branch and down the main branch to the first beginning place which said containing Eighty Acres of Land more or less being part of a Patent for two or hundred and fifty Acres of Land granted the said Robert Athison by the Hon^{ble} Hugh Despard his Majesty's
