 First and principally and far above all worldly things and Enjoyments I Commit my Soul to God our Father of Spirits Trusting and steadfastly believing thro' the merits and better Death & Passion of my alone Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and Remission of all my Sins when Ever this mortall Life shall Cease and my body to be decently Interred after y<sup>e</sup> manner of Christian buriall at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned And for what worldly Estate I hath pleased God to possess me with after my Death and Funerall is defrayed I give bequeath & dispose of as followeth

I Give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin Kitchen Six new pewter dishes & two new pewter basons which are now in the house and my Gun and my Sword and my small Iron pott.

I Give and bequeath all the rest and remainder of my Estate of what nature, kind or property whatsoever unto my Loving wife Sarah Kitchen whom I appoint my whole & Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Domini 1719, the mark of
